Behavior and Expectations

Kindergarten will learn about rules and why we have rules, as well as, being a good citizen. We will apply this learning to our behavior each day. If a student struggles with a particular behavior the following steps will be taken:

- Warning from teacher and a reminder of expectations (if occurring frequently they will receive a "GROW" note - move to yellow
- Continued infraction of a behavior will result in a note home, phone call, or conference when necessary and a consequence (loss of privilege, loss of material, time-out, etc.) - move to red
- Individualized behavior management systems will be utilized if necessary

Homework Activities

- Practice activities for home will begin for students in the next few weeks.
- Each child will receive a red copybook and a homework envelope. In the envelope you will find your child's high frequency words, copybook, and any additional supplemental items provided by your teacher. Students will also bring home a Math Practice book. Completed pages will be torn out and sent through your child's homework envelope to be checked.
 - Some supplemental activities to practice will include practicing sight words, prayers, tying shoes, name/address, etc. Reading with your child is always an excellent activity!


School Liturgies
